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

CeraVe Skin-Renewing Retinol Serum



Board-certified dermatologist <u>Ryan Turner</u> recommends <u>this popular</u> <u>serum</u> because its mix of restorative ingredients can help offset some of retinol's harsher side effects. "It contains an encapsulated retinol (slower release), plus ceramides, hyaluronic acid, and niacinamide, which help support and repair the skin barrier, counteracting the effects of retinols," shared Dr. Turner. Shoppers clearly agree, since the serum has earned nearly 20,000 five-star ratings on Amazon.

<u>La Roche-Posay Retinol B3 Serum</u>



Skin irritation is one of the more common side effects of retinol, so board-certified dermatologist <u>Kristel Polder</u> recommends <u>this serum's</u> soothing ingredients to counteract irritation. "This serum contains niacinamide (vitamin B3), which has been shown to calm the skin and reduce irritation and redness," she said. This serum was also recommended to me by other dermatologists—so it has the stamp of approval from multiple docs.

<u>Kiehl's Retinol Skin-Renewing Daily Microdose Serum</u>



Board-certified dermatologist Jessie Cheung is a fan of this serum because the microdose formula "delivers retinol in a slow and steady dose to help minimize irritation." Meanwhile, ceramides help moisturize skin and peptides boost collagen production, resulting in a sought-after glow. "This product does not inflame your skin, and it is excellent for sensitive skin," wrote one five-star shopper.

First Aid Beauty .3% Retinol Complex Serum



When in doubt, go with a low retinol strength like <u>this pick</u> from Dr. Cheung. "This serum is designed specifically for sensitive skin with a low concentration of retinol," the doctor shared, also noting to take it easy when you begin any retinol treatment. "Start slow with your retinol product," she shared. "Even just once or twice a week, as it can take a few days to see irritation develop."


The Ordinary Retinol .2%

Dr. Turner suggests beginning with low-strength retinol, then gradually increasing strength depending on how your skin reacts—which makes this serum perfect. "The Ordinary offers incremental strengths, so sensitive skin types can start at the lowest concentration and step up as the use is tolerated," he shared, adding that the squalene ingredient also hydrates your skin and counteracts dryness that can occur from retinol.


SkinMedica Retinol .25 Complex

This retinol serum has an encapsulated formula, which means the retinol takes a longer time to penetrate the skin. This reduces irritation, which is one reason board-certified dermatologist <u>Debbie Palmer</u> recommends the serum to patients with sensitive skin. "I start patients on the 0.25 strength and build them up to the 0.5 and 1.0 strength as tolerated," she shared, recommending a pea-size amount for two nights per week to start. If you have extra-sensitive skin, you can apply a <u>plain moisturizer</u> over the retinol to minimize drying.

Neutrogena Rapid Wrinkle Repair Retinol Oil



If you prefer skin care products with a more nourishing texture, this Neutrogena retinol oil is ideal, according to board-certified dermatologist Anetta Reszko. "Because it's oil-based, it cushions the skin and delivers hydration along with the retinol, so it feels less harsh," she explained. "A few drops pressed into the skin at night can be a good way to treat drier or reactive skin types."

Versed Press Restart Gentle Retinol Serum

"This one is doubly good, containing microencapsulated retinol and bakuchiol to help supplement the effects of collagen boosting," shared Dr. Turner, who has found bakuchiol to be a gentler but effective plant-based retinol alternative for the most sensitive skin. Many shoppers enjoy the serum for its lightweight texture and "very gentle, great for beginners" formula.

A313 Cream With Retinyl Palmitate

If you're a fan of French skin care, Dr. Turner suggests this popular pick (and Sienna Miller staple!). "It contains the active ingredient retinyl palmitate that must be converted first to retinol, so it is gentler than retinol," he shared. "It, too, is a type of vitamin A that can be used to help boost collagen and support anti-aging goals." The strength is higher than some other retinols on this list, so be sure to follow the instructions and apply no more than a pea-sized amount.

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
